All workshops run from 10am to 4pm (except Photo Walks which may vary at certain times of the year – please see the Photo Walks page of the Going Digital website or your booking reference for details). Please report to the classroom at 9.45am.

HOW TO GET THERE.

By road - Ilam Park is just a few miles west of the A515 Buxton to Ashbourne road. From Ashbourne, follow the brown tourist signs and head north on A515. Turn left at Sandybrook Hall into Spend Lane. Turn left into Wintercroft Lane. Entering the village, bear right at the memorial onto Ilam Moor Lane and bear left to enter Ilam Park. From Buxton head toward Ashbourne on the A515. Take a right into Washbrook Lane/Narlow Lane; take a right/left across at the Old Dog into Washbrook Lane then on to Ilam.

Car Parking Follow the signs up to the Pay and Display car park - members park free

From the car park head back toward the Hall - and look out for the Going Digital 'golden eye' logo.

REFRESHMENTS Tea and coffee will be available at intervals during the workshops; there is a café on site, or you are very welcome to bring a packed lunch

CONTACT

WHAT TO BRING ON PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS & PHOTO WALKS:

- You will need your camera. Ensure it has fresh/fully charged batteries and a spare battery if you have one.
- Please bring your camera manual if you have a print copy. Please Check carefully as sometimes the printed one you receive only contains basic facts
- Memory card - it is essential that you start the day with an empty, preferably newly formatted, memory card. We will use card readers to transfer your images to our computers, but if we are not able to do this successfully, please bring your camera to computer data cable too.
- Please set your camera to shoot in jpeg (or raw&jpeg), as RAW images can make downloading rather slow
- A camera bag is useful for protecting your camera and equipment when outdoors, and a transparent plastic bag and some sticky tape make a good, temporary waterproof cover for your camera and an umbrella will protect your equipment and you in wet weather.
- Bring a tripod if you have one (essential for Close-up & Macro workshops and Water & Movement workshops - if you don't have one please get in touch as we have loan tripods, free of charge).
- Dress in warm, comfortable clothing for outdoor sessions. A waterproof/ windproof top will be useful. Comfortable but strong footwear is advised for photographing outdoors.
- In addition, it can be quite muddy while out taking photographs, so for the sake of the venue's staff, please bring a change of shoes.
