Workshops at Tatton Park - Stable Courtyard

TIMES

All ITP workshops run from midday until 5-30 (this may vary at certain times of the year, particularly during winter months— please check details on the website or your booking reference). Final joining instructions will be provided prior to the workshop. Please report to The Stable Restaurant upon arrival where your instructor will be waiting for you. All other workshop starting times will be promoted on the website and final confirmation given in joining instructions prior to the workshop date.

HOW TO GET THERE

By road: Tatton is around 2 miles north of Knutsford; 4 miles south of Altrincham; 5 miles from M6 Junction 19; 3 miles from M56, Junction 7. It is well signposted from A556; use the Rostherne entrance on Ashley Road, 1.5 miles north-east of the junction of A5034 with A50. You should enter by the exit gate on the right-hand side, which will be open before the main gate is opened to the general public.

By bus: Buses from Knutsford on high season Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays Easter to end August; otherwise from surrounding areas to Knutsford, then 2 miles.

By train: The nearest railway station is Knutsford, 2 miles.

From the car park follow the path through to the main entrance courtyard. The workshops take place in The Stables Restaurant.

REFRESHMENTS & FACILITIES

There are loos in the courtyard.

Refreshments are available in The Stables Restaurant and hot meals, snacks and cakes are available from the NT cafe in the stable courtyard, or you welcome to bring a packed lunch.

WHAT TO BRING ON 1-DAY PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS & PHOTO WALKS:

- You will need your camera. Ensure it has fresh/fully charged batteries. A spare battery is recommended.
- You will need your fully detailed camera instruction manual. Please check carefully as sometimes the printed
 one you receive only contains basic facts. If you don't have this, you can download a PDF version onto your
 smartphone or other device. If you bring lenses, a hot-shoe mounted flash or other accessories, please bring
 their instruction manuals too.
- Memory card it is essential that you start the day with an empty, formatted memory card. We will use card
 readers to transfer your images, but just in case we are not able to do this successfully, please bring your
 camera to computer data cable too.
- Please set your camera to shoot in jpeg/RAW.
- A camera bag is useful for protecting your camera and equipment when outdoors, and a transparent plastic
 bag and some sticky tape/elastic bands make a good, temporary waterproof cover for your camera.
 Proprietary rain covers are also available from reputable retailers and need not be expensive.
- A tripod or similar support is optional on most workshops you don't need to buy one specially. If you would like to try using a tripod, please contact Andy who will have some for you to borrow for the day. A sturdy tripod is, however, strongly recommended for our *Landscape, Water, Low Light* and some other more advanced workshops (please check course information on the website).
- Dress in suitable clothing for outdoor sessions several thinner layers are more versatile than a single, thicker layer. A waterproof/ windproof jacket will be useful. Comfortable, sturdy footwear or walking boots are advised, especially for Photo walks, and waterproof trousers might also prove useful.
